LOBELVILLE (September) Dutch Tech, Inc. officials announced that the company will invest \$755,000 to expand its insulation manufacturing operations at the company's headquarters in Southern Middle Tennessee.

Dutch Tech will create 73 new jobs in Tier 4, Distressed Perry County three years after the company was founded in Lobelville.

The additional staff will serve as shift

managers, equipment operators and administrative assistants, allowing Dutch Tech to better meet its customer demands and increase production.

COLUMBIA (October) SGB Enterprises, Inc. will invest \$1.7 million to relocate its headquarters and expand its design and manufacturing operations in Tennessee. Through the project, SGB will create 41 new jobs in Columbia.

The move will position SGB in closer proximity to its primary customer base across the Southeast and will be a driving force in allowing SGB to expand its products and services for the commercial and military simulation training sectors.

Founded more than 30 years ago, SGB Enterprises, Inc. specializes in designing and manufacturing procedural training systems, flight simulators, maintenance trainers and other simulated avionics and control components for the aerospace industry. SGB will more than double its employment by expanding to Tennessee.

US Pillars LLC to Expand Manufacturing Operations at Cookeville Headquarters



COOKEVILLE (October) US Pillars LLC will invest \$981,000 to expand manufacturing operations at its headquarters in Cookeville, Tennessee.

US Pillars will create 56 new jobs as the company acquires a wood door product line from Hörmann, a German, family-owned manufacturer headquartered in Sparta.



In 2020, the company completed construction of its 325,000-square-foot state-of-the art manufacturing facility in Sparta, Tennessee, which houses its North American headquarters and operations of both sectional and high-performance door product lines.

Summit Behavioral Healthcare to Expand Williamson County Headquarters

FRANKLIN (November) Summit Behavioral Healthcare officials announced today the company will invest \$4.5 million to expand its Franklin, Tennessee, headquarters.

Through this project, Summit BHC will create 125 new jobs in Williamson County over the next five years.

Summit Behavioral Healthcare was established to develop and operate a network of leading behavioral and mental health centers throughout the country. The company currently operates more



than 35 inpatient facilities that specialize in helping adults, adolescents and families suffering from mental health challenges and addiction. Upon completion of the project, the company will employ more than 450 Tennesseans.

Based in Taiwan, Xxentria Technology Materials Company, Ltd., is a leading manufacturer of metal composite material. The Tennessee location will serve the automotive industry with the composite panels used to manufacture truck and trailer bodies

Xxentria's expansion to Tennessee results from years of research to locate a manufacturing facility in closer proximity to Xxentria's U.S. customer base. The Mt. Pleasant plant will house equipment capable of two lines for lamination and one line for fabrication.

MORRISON (January) Unitech North America, LLC officials announced today the company will invest \$30 million to locate its first U.S. facility in Tennessee.

In phase one of the project, Unitech will create 75 new jobs in Warren County with plans to grow through future expansions.

The Morrison location will specialize in the production of thermal adhesives and battery compression pads for electric vehicle battery manufacturers across the Southeast as well as industrial adhesives and sealers for its automotive customers.

Unitech North America, LLC is a subsidiary of Unitech Co., Ltd., which is headquartered in Ansan, South Korea, and is a leading manufacturer of adhesives and sealants. The expansion to Tennessee represents Unitech's first location in the U.S. and will join the company's other operations in Europe and Asia.

TNECD Announces Four Counties to Participate in Property Evaluation Program



Counties selected represent the Upper Cumberland and Northeast Tennessee regions

PEP originates from TNECD's Select Tennessee Certification Program

NASHVILLE (October) The Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development (TNECD) announced today the four counties selected to participate in the latest round of the Select Tennessee Property Evaluation Program (PEP).

The counties include Carter, **DeKalb**, **Overton** and Washington.

PEP evaluates potential industrial properties, advising counties on industrial site improvements and where investments may be most beneficial. Since its inception in 2015, PEP has helped improve the inventory of industrial sites and buildings across the state, with more than 424 sites being reviewed.

"Tennessee's success in recruiting and landing economic development projects is in part due to the cohesion we have working with community leaders across our state's 95 counties," TNECD Commissioner Stuart C. McWhorter said. "The Select Tennessee Property Evaluation Program is a tool that allows our department to continue supporting our local partners in developing shovel-ready industrial sites, and I am excited to see the economic growth that this latest round of the program brings to Carter, DeKalb, Overton and Washington counties."

PEP originates from TNECD's Select Tennessee Certified Site Program. With assistance from site selection firm Austin Consulting, PEP provides participating counties with guidance on site planning for future industrial development projects.

PEP includes an on-site visit by Austin Consulting and TNECD, an educational webinar on the site selection process and a comprehensive assessment of the strengths and needs of each community's inventory

of industrial sites. This assessment also offers recommendations to improve marketability.

"The Property Evaluation Program allows each community to take an inventory of their future industrial sites, receive a straightforward assessment of each, and build a consensus around which properties offer the best opportunities for industrial growth, whether in the near-, intermediate-, or long-term," said Jonathan Gemmen, senior director of Austin Consulting.

These counties were selected based on the demonstrated local need for industrial properties and the county's ability to assemble properties with viable market potential. The application process begins with a submission of a letter of intent, which is accepted at any time. Upon receipt of the letter, interested communities will receive the PEP application. A new round of communities will be accepted into the program in the spring of 2024 with letters of intent due by January 11, 2024.

TNECD Announces Two New Select Tennessee Certified Sites

The Select Tennessee Certified Sites program helps communities prepare industrial sites for private investment and job creation

NASHVILLE (January) The Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development (TNECD) announced that two sites have been certified through the Select Tennessee Certified Sites program.

Seventy-three sites across Tennessee have been certified to date. The newest certified sites and their local sponsoring agencies include:

"It is clear through today's announcement that the Select Tennessee Certified Sites program plays a critical role in recruiting and landing economic development opportunities across the state," TNECD Commissioner Stuart C. McWhorter said. "This program is not limited to our rural or urban regions and serves as a tool to ensure all 95 counties have the right assets in place to foster future growth."

The Select Tennessee Certified Sites program has helped communities prepare industrial sites for private investment and job creation since 2012. The program sets rigorous standards to give companies Nearly 75 sites have now been certified through the program

detailed and reliable information during the site selection process.

The Select Tennessee certification process ensures that each certified site meets high quality standards and are primed for development. Qualifications for certification include having at least 20 acres of developable land for industrial operations, documented environmental conditions and geotechnical analysis, existing onsite utilities or a formal plan to extend utilities to the site, and truck-quality road access. TNECD has partnered with Austin Consulting to administer the certified sites program.

"The Select Tennessee Certified Sites program provides companies with access to development-ready properties across the state, whether seeking an urban or rural location," said Jonathan Gemmen, senior director of Austin Consulting. "The EDGE property and Lawrenceburg Industrial Park are just two examples of the diversity of market-ready sites Tennessee has to offer."

TNECD (January) Department of Economic and Community Development Commissioner Stuart C. McWhorter announced 12 new Site Development Grants.

The grants, totaling approximately \$17.9 million, are designed to help communities invest in infrastructure and engineering improvements to land economic development projects and achieve Select Tennessee site certification.

"TNECD's Site Development Grants play a critical role in preparing Tennessee communities for economic development growth, which directly supports our focus of ensuring every Tennessean has access to a high-quality job," said Governor Bill Lee. "I thank the General Assembly for partnering with us to fund this important program."

The Site Development Grant program, part of the Rural Economic Opportunity Act, works in tandem with TNECD's Select Tennessee program. Since 2016, TNECD has awarded 174 Site Development Grants across the state, totaling nearly \$85 million in assistance to local communities and generating 6,595 new jobs for Tennesseans.

"Having a shovel-ready industrial site is a key component many of our communities need to land business investment and spur job creation," said McWhorter. "These grants serve as a steppingstone for Tennesseans to achieve a better quality of life, and I look forward to seeing the economic development growth that follows this latest round of funding."
